20 Question Self-Assessment Tool to Gauge Hospital-Physician Alignment

Becker's Hospital Review has compiled the following list of 20 questions to serve as a self-assessment for hospitals to gauge how well they align with physicians. It's primarily a test intended for hospital and physician leaders, but may be useful for other decision makers in the healthcare industry. The questions were developed based on interviews with hospital executives, consultants and physicians, as well as reports from the American Hospital Association, Coker Group and L.E.K. Consulting.

For each question, rate your hospital on a 1 to 5 scale by circling the number the best represents how well your hospital achieves each objective: Five indicates this is an absolute strength of your hospital, and one means there is major room for improvement. Three suggests your hospital is somewhere in the middle. If any question does not seem to apply to your hospital, circle three.
